SHORT OVERVIEW

CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) course for teachers designed to train educators to teach subject content (like science, history, math...) through a second language. The main objective is to integrate language learning with subject learning, so students can develop their language skills while also learning content or specific knowledge.

In this course you will be able to discover all the concepts you need to know to adapt your teaching methodology and educational processes to the CLIL method.

CLIL has already been implemented as the best methodology for teaching a subject through another language in many bilingual and multilingual institutions.
